Since the election, it is obvious that we cannot expect the federal government to act on climate issues.

Our invitation is for teams from congregations in each of the four quadrants of the city (NE, SE, SW, Downtown-NW) to participate in one weekend EcoFaith Institute (November 3 - 5) to become

grounded in the Practices for Awakening Leadership, build relationships with other congregations within your quadrant, and prepare to kick off the PJET Initiative. The congregations within each quadrant will then form a team which will receive ongoing coaching and support throughout the duration of the campaign. Our vision is that the relationships formed, the practices learned, the leadership developed, and the spiritual and organizing support received will increase capacity within and between congregations not only for PJET but for years to come.

Through a generous grant from the Bishop of the Oregon Synod-ELCA, the leadership of EcoFaith Recovery's Beyond Fossil Fuels leadership team, and the participation of several Lutheran congregations, the entire cost of the institute and 15 hours of coaching per team is \$128 per person! What a tremendous opportunity for faith-based organizing!

1) ACCESS Spiritual Power: Consciously connect with the indwelling God to

rediscover our belovedness, our God-given power, and

our place within God's evolving universe.

2) DEVELOP Relationships: Consciously awaken the power-among that arises when

we engage in authentic conversation and relationship.

3) DISCOVER our Stories: Consciously recognize the power of God's presence at

work within our lived experience, the lives of others, and

the stories of the places we live.

4) MENTOR One Another: Consciously draw out the gifts, wisdom and life-giving

power of others, and share our own, by mentoring and

being mentored.

5) ACT together: Consciously engage the power of collective action, in

the service of God's healing and justice-seeking work

for human communities and the whole creation.

6) REFLECT on our Actions: Consciously reflect upon and evaluate our actions and

the ways we use power, in order to learn and grow into

mature and courageous leaders.

7) RESTORE Balance: Consciously re-align our lives with the sacred and

natural rhythms of Life expressed through the whole of

God's creation.
