Our recovery deepens as we call our religious, political and economic institutions to enter recovery with us.



We do this by seeding and nurturing eco-spiritual practices within existing faith communities and sponsoring Leadership Development Initiatives which bring leaders together across diverse communities of faith to unleash our spiritual/relational power for the healing of human communities and the web of life of which we are a part. ## **Grounding for Action Beyond Fossil Fuels**

Join Christians and others of good will who are building strength to participate in the fossil fuel resistance movement and who seek spiritual grounding, shared values, common practices, and real relationships from which to act. . . and act powerfully! In our time together you can expect:

- cultivating spiritual practices which marshal relational power through community organizing (inspired by principles and practices of the Industrian Areas Foundation),

- values and language from the tradition of Kingian nonviolence as supported by our partnership in this effort with an organization called *On Earth Peace* which helps individuals, congregations, and communities grow in peace through training and accompaniment, and
- the wisdom of the 12-step Recovery movement.

- opportunities to reflect together about recent fossil fuels organizing and actions; and
- learning about and connecting with upcoming actions led by the many groups working to stop proposed fossil fuel exports.

- How to build power to create opportunities within the double eco-crisis (ecology and economy),

**Simply in Season Leadership Training** equips new leaders to form small food faith and fellowship groups using the Simply in Season cookbook published by the Mennonite Church. Leaders are trained to start Simply in Season groups which to prepare healthy/sustainable meals, share food in community, engage in Biblical reflection, experiment with new spiritual practices, and learn how the food we eat impacts our bodies, our communities and the larger web of life. We make connections between Christian faith, spirituality, and the impact our food purchases and production choices have on ourselves, our neighbors and all of God's creation.
