## Why does EcoFaith Recovery exist?

- · To identify existing and emerging leaders,
- develop our leadership potential through EcoFaith's "Practices for Awakening Leadership," and
- lift one another up to support our faith communities in taking courageous public action for the recovery of human life and the healing of God's creation.

A spiritually grounded approach to recovering our God-given vocations so we can grow as leaders, maintain balance, prevent burnout, and become more effective over time.

#### These Practices for Awakening Leadership include

- 1) spiritual grounding,
- 2) relational conversations,
- 3) telling our stories,
- 4) rhythms of engagement,
- 5) mentoring, and
- 6) conscious leadership development.

Each of the six Practices above has four dimensions: personal, interpersonal, community and public sphere.

#### What are EcoFaith Initiatives?

EcoFaith Initiatives bring leaders together across diverse communities of faith to learn about and engage in the *Practices for Awakening Leadership* together. By engaging in the Practices, we expand our own leadership capacity and learn how to use the *Practices* for in our leadership efforts within our communities of faith and other communities.
