#### Together, we are actually doing something about it!

EcoFaith Recovery is a faith-based leadership development network of volunteer leaders who lift one another up to support our communities in taking courageous public action for a just world where all have clean air, safe water, and healthy food. We reclaim the wisdom of our faith traditions, repent of the ways we participate in injustice, liberate our imaginations,

claim our unique callings, and organize our communities to achieve this vision. Since our founding in 2009, EcoFaith Recovery has inspired emerging leaders through dozens of workshops, organized hundreds of people to participate in public actions, and equipped 30 young adults across the country through year-long mentored, stipended internships.

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EcoFaith's internship cohorts are central to EcoFaith's vision. They gather with other EcoFaith leaders to begin their internships at an EcoFaith Leadership Institute and then meet regularly with fellow interns and personal mentors. Like all EcoFaith leaders, they are thoroughly grounded in our *Practices for Awakening Leadership*, seven experiential exercises which help us equip our communities to take practical steps to put faith into action by addressing climate change and working for justice for those who lack clean air, safe water and healthy food. Photos of EcoFaith's 30 interns to date are included below.

The Challenge: For the past six years, EcoFaith has depended upon \$25,000 of grant funding per year to fund our internship program. This represents half of the annual \$50,000 budget which supports all of our volunteer leaders. Such grant funding is inherently unstable. It rises and falls with the interests and capacities of grant funders. We must stabilize the funding for our internship program. To help us achieve this goal, InFaith Community Foundation will match \$12,000 in NEW OR INCREASED GIFTS and NEWLY ESTABLISHED MONTHLY **DONATIONS** from individuals and faith communities. We **must** raise the funds in order to receive the match. Then in 2019, we must maintain that increased giving and raise additional funds to replace the current grant. We embrace this opportunity to engage more individual donors and congregations in equipping future generations of young adult leaders.

The Invitation: EcoFaith interns are *central* to our vision for a just world where all have clean air, safe water, and healthy food. We invite new first-time donors to make tax-deductible gifts or to initiate on-going monthly gifts ranging from \$5 - \$400 per month to enable us to meet the match. We also invite pledges for 2019 to build capacity.

## EcoFaith's Accomplishments To Date:

Since its founding by a circle of eight in 2009 until its current form as a network of hundreds of leaders, EcoFaith has:

- Equipped 30 young adults across the country through mentored, stipended internships,
- Trained over 125 Care for Creation Leaders and 200 people through the "Organizing in the Biocommons" Course,
- Organized over 185 people to take faith-based action through EcoFaith's Beyond Fossil Fuels Initiative,
- Supported over 225 leaders in developing their leadership potential through Weekend Institutes, Congregational Coaching of Eco-Reformation Projects, Portland Clean Energy Fund Organizing, Simply in Season Leadership Trainings, Simpler Living Practice Groups, and Columbia River Watershed Discipleship course,
- Inspired 300 people to connect faith, justice and ecology through EcoFaith Youth Camps, Table Talks, & Retreats

### EcoFaith's Vision for 2019 and Beyond



Equip 5 more young adult interns across the country in 2019 via a year-long internship cohort process. Vision of 50 future interns per year (10 cohorts x 5 interns).



Interns organize their communities to participate in local campaigns which advance the vision of a just and life-giving world where all have clean air, safe water and healthy food.



Engage faith communities in existing campaigns for a just world where all have clean air, safe water & healthy food in 2019. Vision of 25 EcoFaith chapters across country in the future.



Expand EcoFaith Leadership Institutes across country, providing weekend immersions into The Practices for Awakening Leadership to all interns and many others. Future vision of 12 per year.



Raise up former EcoFaith interns and others to serve as Presenters at *EcoFaith Leadership Institutes* and Coaches of EcoFaith interns and congregational teams. Vision of 20 new leaders per year.



Launch monthly online gatherings in 2019 where EcoFaith leaders across the country gather to mentor one another. Expand to weekly gatherings as funds permit.
